

Statement: My child is happy at this school.


Our feedback: We are really pleased that an overwhelming majority of children are happy in school, although of course, we are always striving for 100%. Please remind your children of their network of safe adults who they can speak to if they have a worry or concern in school (this is covered as part of our Taking Care lessons in PSHE).

We also have Wellbeing Warriors: pupils who have been trained to give peer support on the playground and help pupils with reporting any concerns to an adult.

Please do let us know if you do not feel that your child is happy at school, as there are lots of ways that we can help! In the first instance, please speak to your child's class teacher. Any continuing concerns can be escalated to the Year Head or a member of the Senior Leadership Team if necessary. We also have Pupil and Family Mentors and a Behaviour Mentor who can provide pastoral support.



Statement: The school lets me know how my child is doing.



Our feedback: One of the key ways that we share information is via Class charts. This has replaced Class Dojo as our main source of communication. Information on how to download the APP and log in has been sent home, but if you are having difficulty signing up, please contact the school office on 01788 577914. We use Class Charts to share information about learning, behaviour and general year group messages, so it is very important that you sign up for access. You can also report absences using Class Charts.

We hold parents' evenings twice a year to report on your child's progress, and provide an annual written report in the summer term.

Throughout the year, we will always contact you by Class Charts, telephone and/or letter if there are any concerns regarding your child's attendance, behaviour or learning. We will also communicate your child's achievements such as star of the week and half termly role model. If your child receives one of these awards, you will be invited to a celebration assembly to see it being presented.

In Year 6, the children used their art skills to redesign the school logo inspired by the Ward-Boughton-Leigh family crest . They also enjoyed partying away at the disco!
















This half term, year 6 have shown commitment and dedication to their lessons, embracing our learning behaviours in all that they do. We are super proud how they have settled into Year 6.

Tag Rugby Festival








Tag Rugby

As writers, the children have written Autumn inspired poems and instructions about how to wash a prehistoric animal, linked to the text, 'How to wash a Woolly Mammoth'.


As Scientists, we have been looking at rocks and soils, we have enjoyed conducting experiments, learning about how soil is made and learning about Mary Anning!










A feu important reminders:


The number of children using TikTok and Snapchat rose last year in Britain, according to research published by media regulator Ofcom.

Around half of those aged between three and 17 use TikTok and Snapchat, figures collected as part of the watchdog's annual survey of children's and parents' online attitudes showed.

The study found a slight increase in both apps' popularity in the past year, with TikTok now being used by 53% of children (up from 50%), and Snapchat by 46% (up from 42%). Both companies have faced mounting pressure over user safety in recent months. Particually for Primary Children who are lying about their age to gain access. Add this to the fact that 1 in 5 British children now have a phone capable of accessing the web by the age of 5 and you will understand our concern.

It is essential that as parents and carers we do all we can to help our chidlren make good choices and keep themselves safe. and that usually means being alongside them on their digital journey!
