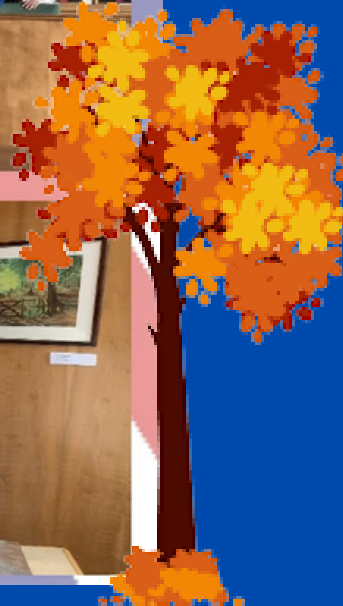
The children absolutely loved his assembly and are looking forward to this new venture!

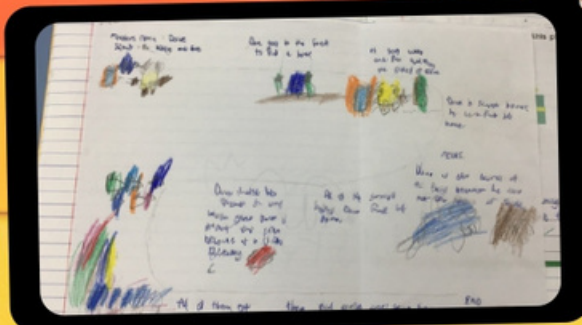
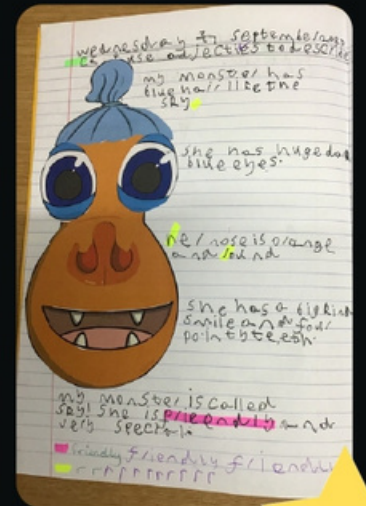

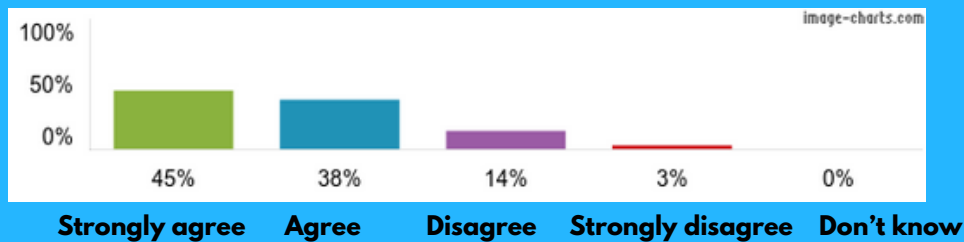

OFSTED Questionnaire feedback

As part of our recent OFSTED inspection, parents were invited to give their views about school via Parent View. In each newsletter, we will be giving feedback on some of the statements and responses.

Statement: My child is happy at this school.



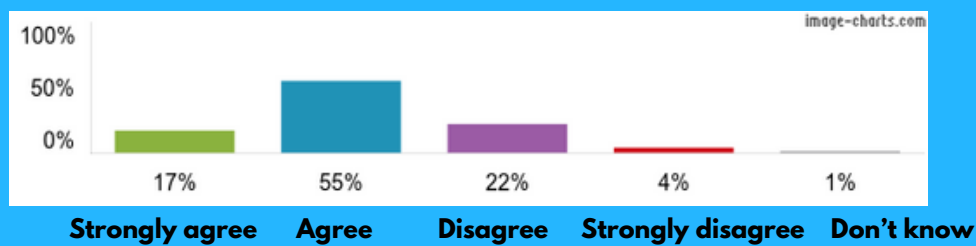
Our feedback: We are really pleased that an overwhelming majority of children are happy in school, although of course, we are always striving for 100%. Please remind your children of their network of safe adults who they can speak to if they have a worry or concern in school (this is covered as part of our Taking Care lessons in PSHE).

We also have Wellbeing Warriors: pupils who have been trained to give peer support on the playground and help pupils with reporting any concerns to an adult.

Please do let us know if you do not feel that your child is happy at school, as there are lots of ways that we can help! In the first instance, please speak to your child's class teacher. Any continuing concerns can be escalated to the Year Head or a member of the Senior Leadership Team if necessary. We also have Pupil and Family Mentors and a Behaviour Mentor who can provide pastoral support.



Statement: The school lets me know how my child is doing.



Our feedback: One of the key ways that we share information is via Class charts. This has replaced Class Dojo as our main source of communication. Information on how to download the APP and log in has been sent home, but if you are having difficulty signing up, please contact the school office on 01788 577914. We use Class Charts to share information about learning, behaviour and general year group messages, so it is very important that you sign up for access. You can also report absences using Class Charts.

We hold parents' evenings twice a year to report on your child's progress, and provide an annual written report in the summer term.

Throughout the year, we will always contact you by Class Charts, telephone and/or letter if there are any concerns regarding your child's attendance, behaviour or learning. We will also communicate your child's achievements such as star of the week and half termly role model. If your child receives one of these awards, you will be invited to a celebration assembly to see it being presented.

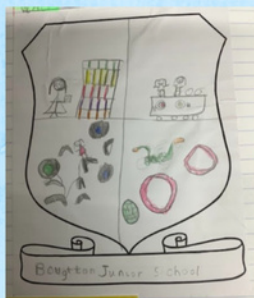
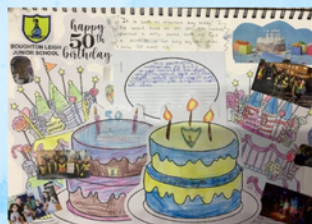
HAPPY 50TH BIRTHDAY BLJS !

YEAR 3:

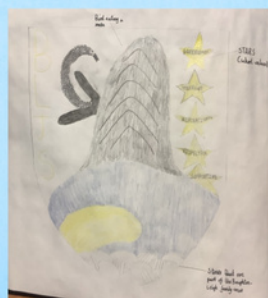
In Year 3, the children designed the perfect party celebration. They used their skills to budget for a party, designed a cake and then had a fantastic time at the school disco!

Mr Sawyer's dance moves were funky, but Miss Hobday managed to steal the votes of the children when she won the Staff Dance Award.



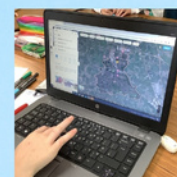
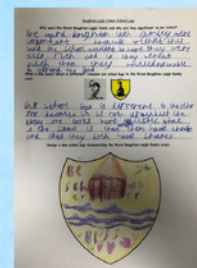
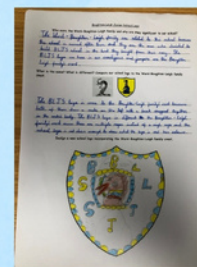
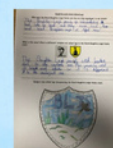
YEAR 5:

In Year 6, the children used their art skills to redesign the school logo inspired by the Ward-Boughton-Leigh family crest. They also enjoyed partying away at the disco!

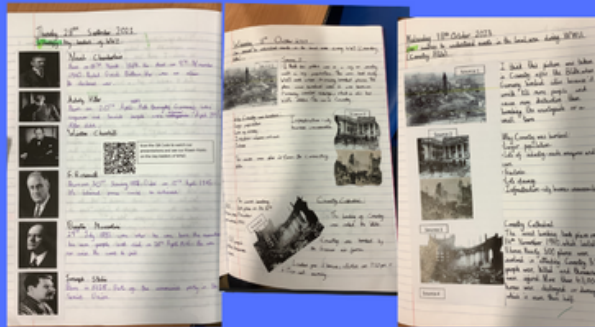

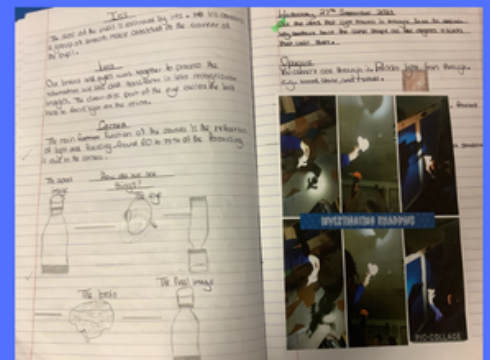


This half term, year 6 have shown commitment and dedication to their lessons, embracing our learning behaviours in all that they do. We are super proud how they have settled into Year 6.



As historians we have been learning about WWII, we have analysed the events which led up to war being declared, researched key leaders and identified what life was like during this period for the people of Britain and also in our local area.

As scientists we have learnt about Light focusing on how we see objects, shadows and refractions. We have worked scientifically, developing our predicting and experimenting skills.



As writers, we have worked incredibly hard in our English lessons this half term to produce a leaflet on Berlin. Children researched the city and learnt about the features used to make a piece of writing persuasive focusing on language.

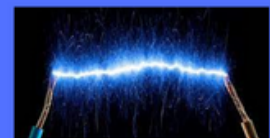


Tag Rugby Festival

As Writers, we have written non-chronological reports about mystical creatures inspired by J.K. Rowling's book "Fantastic beasts and where to find them"

We have also written a narrative focusing on describing settings, characters and building atmosphere. This was inspired by "Harry Potter and the Philosopher's stone", a worldwide known book about an eleven-year-old orphan who discovers he is a wizard and is invited to study at Hogwarts.

As Geographers, we have explored the physical and human features of Warwickshire.

We have also explored our local area and the economic and environmental impact of CEMEX in Rugby.

As Scientists, we have explored different forces and carried out scientific experiments.

As Mathematicians, we have further developed our knowledge of number and place value, as well as the four calculations and interpreting data.

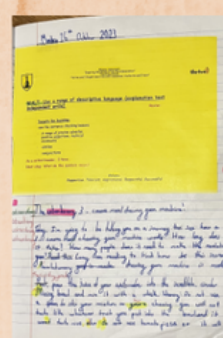
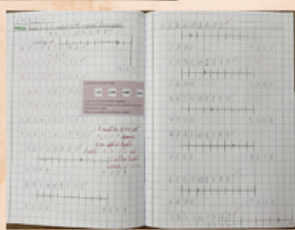
YEAR 4

As part of a whole school Rugby study, the children have been keen geographers and have studied the area of Brownsover and how it has changed from 1890 to present day. The children have examined a range of maps from different time periods and considered why someone might want to live in Brownsover.

As historians, the children have been learning about the Ancient Greeks and their beliefs. The children have also taken part in an enquiry into the Trojan War and how the Trojan Horse was used to gain an advantage in battle. In addition to this, the children have also learnt how the Greeks have shaped our society today through their contributions to architecture, maths and politics.

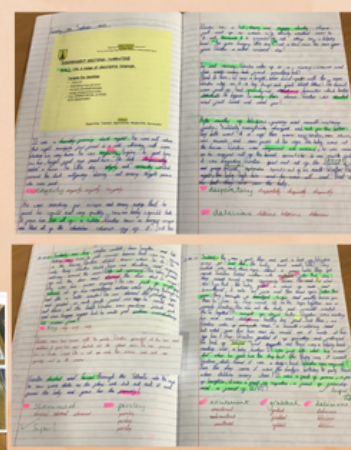


As mathematicians, the children have recapped their knowledge of place value which has allowed them to round numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. The children have also had the opportunity to problem solve using column addition and subtraction. The children have also used their knowledge of multiplication facts to derive number facts that are 10, 100 and 1000 times greater.



As writers, the children have had the opportunity to produce a narrative piece of writing based on the visual text 'Feast' and an explanation text all about Willy Wonka's incredible 3-course dinner gum machine!

As Scientists, we have been learning all about electricity. The children have had the opportunity to create different circuits and draw them scientifically. They have used their investigation skills allowing them to predict and reason using scientific vocabulary.



As artists, the children have used their skills of tone and texture to sketch an image of Brownsover Hall inspired by our local visit. The children have also been learning about the artist Piet Mondrian and creating some Greek style pottery decorated in the style of Mondrian's most famous works.

We know that this is going to be an amazing year!

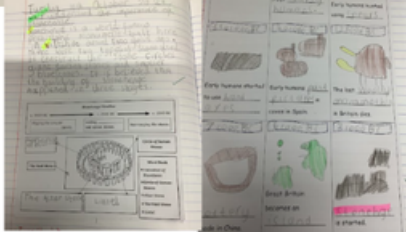
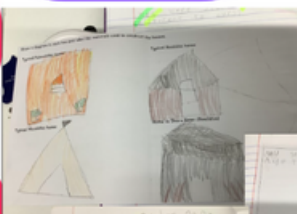


We have completed our first two units of the scheme, Maths Mastery. We have focused on place value and addition and subtraction.

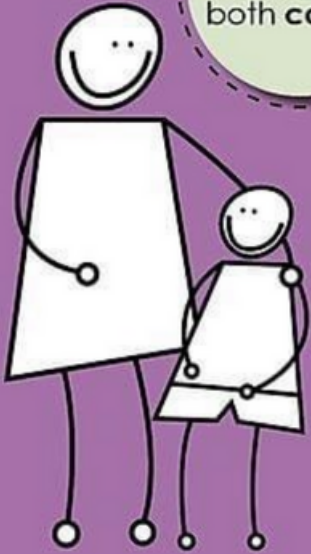

Being a parent is exciting and rewarding but there are also times when children behave in ways that are challenging.

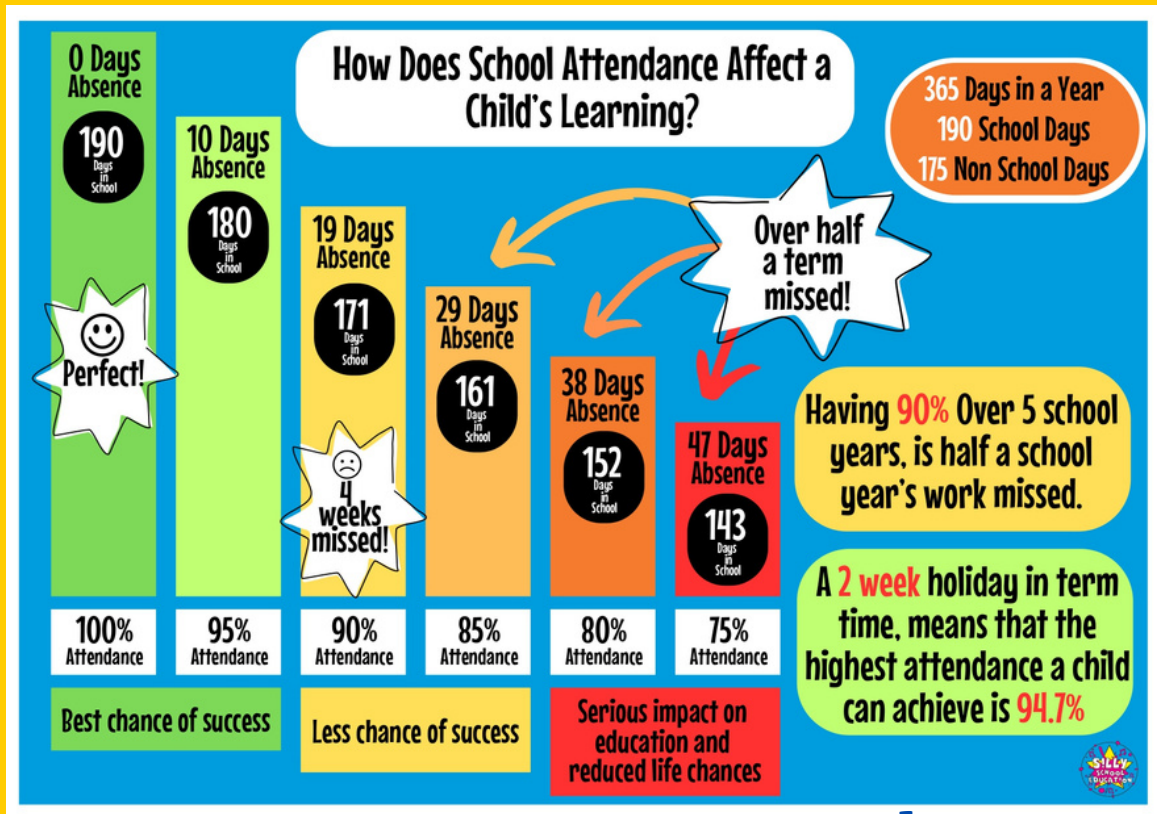
The Nurturing programme helps deal with those challenges so that you can have a calmer, happier life.

The number of children using TikTok and Snapchat rose last year in Britain, according to research published by media regulator Ofcom.

Around half of those aged between three and 17 use TikTok and Snapchat, figures collected as part of the watchdog's annual survey of children's and parents' online attitudes showed.

The study found a slight increase in both apps' popularity in the past year, with TikTok now being used by 53% of children (up from 50%), and Snapchat by 46% (up from 42%).

Both companies have faced mounting pressure over user safety in recent months. Particularly for Primary Children who are lying about their age to gain access. Add this to the fact that 1 in 5 British children now have a phone capable of accessing the web by the age of 5 and you will understand our concern.

It is essential that as parents and carers we do all we can to help our children make good choices and keep themselves safe, and that usually means being alongside them on their digital journey!

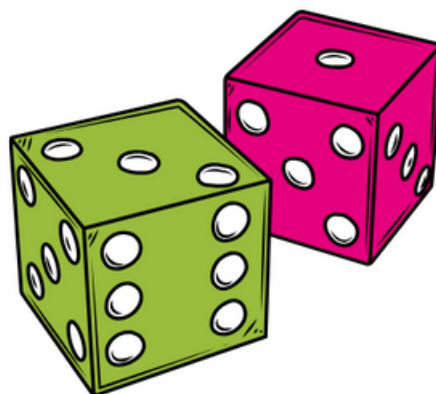
